Feed My Sheep

Jesus, knowing he was soon to ascend to his rightful place beside his Father in heaven, sought out Peter on the beach by the Sea of Galilee and implored him to "feed my sheep"* asking not just once but three times. Christ knew that his beloved people, given to him by his Father before creation and purchased with his own blood, must be nurtured, and instructed and protected. His infant Church, soon to be born into a dangerous and hostile world, must have stalwart shepherds if it were to survive. Accordingly, Peter, in his first epistle, writes,

"So, I exhort the elders among you, as a fellow elder and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, as well as a partaker in the glory that is going to be revealed: shepherd the flock of God that is among you, exercising oversight, not under compulsion, but willingly, as God would have you, not for shameful gain, but eagerly, not domineering over those in your charge, but being examples to the flock."

1 Peter 5:1-3

Paul too was driven without ceasing to secure the health and safety and welfare of Christ's fledgling churches once planted. Every one of his Epistles held dire warnings against those things that would seek to destroy the flock. Foremost among them the danger of false teaching. Before leaving Ephesus, Paul calls the Elders together with this message of caution,

"Pay careful attention to yourselves and to all the flock, in which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to care for the church of God, which he obtained with his own blood. I know that after my departure fierce wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock; and from among your own selves will arise men speaking twisted things, to draw away the disciples after them. Therefore, be alert, remembering that for three years I did not cease night or day to admonish everyone with tears. And now I commend you to God and to the word of his grace, which is able to build you up and to give you the inheritance among all those who are sanctified." Acts 20:28-32

But do these ancient warnings and pleadings for strong and faithful shepherds grounded in the word of God hold the same significance for us today? After all, those first churches of Jews and Gentiles were isolated islands surrounded by a brutal and debauched 1st century pre-Christian world. I contend that though we are physically safer and more financially secure, there exists a clear parallel between that 1st century pre-Christian world and our 21st century post-Christian one. Western Europe, once known as Christendom, now counts only 4% of its population as identifying Christians. Its once great churches have been transformed into upscale apartments, restaurants, and night clubs. America has not yet suffered such a devastating decline, but we would be foolish to not take heed.

There is good news. The war is won. Jesus said, "...I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it."** Yes, Jesus has won the war, but there are still battles to be fought. Ephesians 6 tells us, "Put on the whole armor of God that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil." Our 21st century congregation, more than ever, needs strong, resolute shepherds—shepherds grounded in the word, led by faith, and ever relying on Christ's strength to oversee their flock. Never be foolish enough to think wolves no longer exist; they simply updated their garb.

As we enter our officer nominating process, I encourage all members to be in earnest prayer for our church and pray that God's loving grace and wisdom be granted to all who participate in this process. Pray for the gift of discernment for those who choose to nominate, and pray that those who desire to serve will find courage in the knowledge that it is Christ's wisdom and strength and not their own that will guide and uphold them. Lastly, I ask that each of you, both nominators and nominees, consider very carefully what it means to take on the responsibility of overseeing and protecting Christ's people.
