Hello Everyone,

It is time for the annual update of completed and upcoming projects at the church. First Presbyterian Church has completed these major projects:

- Roof and steeple shingles have been replaced
- Steeple stones have been repaired
- Sanctuary ceiling has been repaired
- The air conditioner in kitchen has been replaced
- 110 overhead fluorescent lights have been converted to LED

We have spent a lot of money performing the repairs, but we have also saved a lot of money too. We had to contract the work on the roof and ceiling but with the help of church members we were able to upgrade 70 overhead lights just for the cost of new bulbs. The kitchen air conditioner was replaced by church members.

The following projects are upcoming; many will be completed this year:

- Replace wooden fence on South side of parking lot
- Replace 18 Old Church Building second floor Windows
- Convert 32 Mansell Hall lights to LED
- Convert remaining Library lights to LED
- Pressure wash and reseal 1962 Church addition roof
- Repair and paint South Street white doors
- Numerous areas need touch-up painting

We have been incredibly blessed with a beautiful building. As the custodians of this church, it is our duty to maintain our facilities. We could use your help. We have many ongoing jobs, from minor maintenance, to painting, to cleaning, to ceiling light LED conversion, and more. If you would like to help with our projects, please let me know.
